Ejona Icka is a licensed clinical psychologist by the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Kosovo.

With over ten years of experience in the clinical and psychosocial field, Ms. Icka has worked as a clinical psychologist at KRCT, providing support for survivors of gender-based violence, vulnerable groups, and individuals under the protection of UNHCR.
