Every member of UBT's academic community is actively engaged in the quality assurance process within the faculty. This collective involvement is essential for fostering a culture of continuous quality improvement and accountability within all spheres of academic operations.

At the Faculty level, the Quality Sub-Committee is responsible for performing all the work related to quality assurance within the faculty and the regular monitoring and process of teaching and learning inside the Faculty of Information Systems. The IS Faculty has a designated Quality Assurance Sub-Committee on a program level with a Quality Assurance Officer for each branch that works in full harmonization with UBT Quality Assurance Committee and Quality Manager.

The aim of the IS Quality Assurance Sub-Committee is to provide excellence in performance by discussing annual work programmes focusing on the goals and the quality improvement measures, discussing business reports focusing on reports on quality, discussing approaches towards periodical detailed self-evaluations and external evaluations, discussing results of evaluations and proposed measures for improvement, discussing effects of individual quality assurance mechanisms and proposing improvement measures, reporting to the Faculty Council on quality achievements, proposing improvement measures for adoption on both decision making bodies, monitoring implementation of student questionnaires and proposing improvement measures for their use. All this work is done with the aim of continuous improvement in the Faculty with the aim of providing the best possible environment for lecturers and students and creating a healthy learning ecosystem at the Faculty of Information Systems.

Evaluation by students represents a very important indicator for measuring the quality performance in the Faculty. The Faculty of Information Systems has defined the threshold of 4.15 (out of 5) as a satisfactory level, which represents satisfaction at the level of 83%. Every part evaluated less than that, is looked at carefully with the aim of finding the indicators that have sent to that state and then identifying the opportunities for improvement by giving the relevant recommendations.
